RESOLUTION TO ISSUE UNLIMITED TAX GENERAL OBLIGATION LIBRARY BONDS

At a regular meeting of the Township Board of the Charter Township of Lyon, Oakland County, Michigan (the "Township"), held on August 7, 2024.

BOND RESOLUTION Unlimited Tax General Obligation Library Bonds, Series 2024

WHEREAS, at the general election held in the Township on November 8, 2022, the issuance of unlimited tax general obligation bonds in the principal amount of not to exceed \$13,000,000 for the purpose of paying the costs of acquiring, constructing, furnishing, and equipping a new, approximately 19,000 sq. ft. public library facility on Township property and improving the site thereof (the "Project") was approved by a majority of the electors of the Township voting thereon (the vote thereon being 6,438 in favor of and 4,679 against the issuance of the bonds); and

WHEREAS, the Township Board has determined that it is in the best interest of the Township to issue bonds for such purpose at this time.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Board of the Charter Township of Lyon, Michigan, as follows:

- 1. <u>AUTHORIZATION OF BONDS PURPOSE</u>. Bonds of the Township aggregating the principal sum of not to exceed Thirteen Million Dollars (\$13,000,000) shall be issued and sold for the purpose of defraying all or part of the cost of the Project.
- 2. BOND DETAILS. The bonds shall be designated "Unlimited Tax General Obligation Library Bonds, Series 2024," or such other designation as may be determined by the Authorized Officer; shall be dated the date of their delivery; shall be numbered from 1 upwards; shall be fully registered; shall be in the denomination of \$5,000 each or any integral multiple thereof not exceeding the aggregate principal amount for each maturity at the option of the purchaser thereof; shall bear interest at a rate or rates not exceeding 6% per annum to be determined upon the sale thereof and payable semiannually on such dates as shall be determined by order of the Supervisor or Treasurer of the Township (each, an "Authorized Officer"); and shall be serial and/or term bonds and mature on such dates and in such amounts as shall be determined by order of the Authorized Officer; provided, however, that the final principal maturity of the bonds shall be not later than May 1, 2054. If the original purchaser of the bonds shall designate certain of the bonds as term bonds, the principal maturities of the bonds shall become mandatory redemption requirements in accordance with the provisions of Section 6 and the form of bond set forth in Section 10. In the absence of the Authorized Officer, the Clerk shall exercise any authority granted to the Authorized Officer as contemplated by and in furtherance of the provisions of this Bond Resolution.

If requested by the original purchaser of the bonds and determined by the Authorized Officer, the bonds may be issued in the form of a single bond with an exhibit containing the principal maturity amounts and applicable interest rates and due dates.

- 3. PAYMENT OF PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST. The principal of and interest on the bonds shall be payable in lawful money of the United States. Principal shall be payable upon presentation and surrender of the bonds to the bond registrar and paying agent as they severally mature; provided, however, that the Authorized Officer may determine by order that presentation and surrender of the bonds to the bond registrar and paying agent are not required for payment of some or all of the principal installments, and in such case such principal installments shall be paid to the registered owner of the bond as shown on the registration books. Interest shall be paid to the registered owner of each bond as shown on the registration books at the close of business on the 15th day of the calendar month preceding the month in which the interest payment is due. Interest shall be paid when due by check or draft drawn upon and mailed by the bond registrar and paying agent to the registered owner at the registered address.
- 4. <u>BOOK-ENTRY SYSTEM.</u> Initially, one fully-registered bond for each maturity, in the aggregate amount of such maturity, shall be issued in the name of Cede & Co., as nominee of The Depository Trust Company ("DTC") for the benefit of other parties (the "Participants") in the book-entry-only transfer system of DTC. In the event the Township determines that it is in the best interest of the Township not to continue the book-entry system of transfer or that the interests of the holders of the bonds might be adversely affected if the book-entry system of transfer is continued, the Township may notify DTC and the bond registrar and paying agent, whereupon DTC will notify the Participants of the availability through DTC of bond certificates. In such event, the bond registrar and paying agent shall deliver, transfer and exchange bond certificates as requested by DTC and any Participant or "beneficial owner" in appropriate amounts in accordance with this Bond Resolution. DTC may determine to discontinue providing

its services with respect to the bonds at any time by giving notice to the Township and the bond registrar and paying agent and discharging its responsibilities with respect thereto under applicable law or the Township may determine that DTC is incapable of discharging its duties and may so advise DTC. In either such event, the Township shall use reasonable efforts to locate another securities depository. Under such circumstances (if there is no successor securities depository), the Township and the bond registrar and paying agent shall be obligated to deliver bond certificates in accordance with the procedures established by this Bond Resolution. In the event bond certificates are issued, the provisions of this Bond Resolution shall apply to, among other things, the transfer and exchange of such certificates and the method of payment of principal of and interest on such certificates. Whenever DTC requests the Township and the bond registrar and paying agent to do so, the Township and the bond registrar and paying agent shall cooperate with DTC in taking appropriate action after reasonable notice to make available one or more separate certificates evidencing the bonds to any Participant having bonds credited to its DTC account or to arrange for another securities depository to maintain custody of certificates evidencing the bonds.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this Bond Resolution to the contrary, so long as any bond is registered in the name of Cede & Co., as nominee of DTC, all payments with respect to the principal of, interest on and redemption premium, if any, on the bonds and all notices with respect to the bonds shall be made and given, respectively, to DTC. The Authorized Officer is authorized to sign the Blanket Issuer Letter of Representations on behalf of the Township in such form as such official deems necessary or appropriate in order to accomplish the issuance of the bonds in accordance with law and this Bond Resolution.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this resolution to the contrary, if the Authorized Officer deems it to be in the best interest of the Township, the bonds shall not initially be issued through the book-entry-only transfer system of DTC.

- 5. <u>OPTIONAL REDEMPTION</u>. The bonds shall be subject to optional redemption prior to maturity upon such terms and conditions as shall be determined by order of the Authorized Officer.
- 6. MANDATORY PRIOR REDEMPTION. If any of the bonds are designated by the original purchaser as term bonds such bonds shall be subject to mandatory prior redemption at par and accrued interest in accordance with the maturity schedule determined by the Authorized Officer and upon the terms and conditions set forth in the form of bond contained in Section 10 hereof. The bonds to be redeemed shall be selected by lot.
- 7. BOND REGISTRAR AND PAYING AGENT. The Authorized Officer shall designate, and may enter into an agreement with, a bond registrar and paying agent for the bonds that shall be a bank or trust company located in the State of Michigan that is qualified to act in such capacity under the laws of the United States of America or the State of Michigan. The Authorized Officer may from time to time as required designate a similarly qualified successor bond registrar and paying agent. Alternatively, the Treasurer may serve as bond registrar and paying agent for the bonds if the Authorized Officer determines it is in the best interest of the Township.
- 8. <u>EXECUTION, AUTHENTICATION AND DELIVERY OF BONDS.</u> The bonds shall be executed in the name of the Township by the manual or facsimile signatures of the Supervisor and the Clerk and authenticated by the manual signature of an authorized representative of the bond registrar and paying agent. After the bonds have been executed and authenticated for delivery to the original purchaser thereof, they shall be delivered by the Authorized Officer to the purchaser upon receipt of the purchase price. Additional bonds bearing the facsimile signatures of the Supervisor and the Clerk may be delivered to the bond registrar and paying agent for

authentication and delivery in connection with the exchange or transfer of bonds. The bond registrar and paying agent shall indicate on each bond the date of its authentication.

9. <u>EXCHANGE AND TRANSFER OF BONDS</u>. Any bond, at the option of the registered owner thereof and upon surrender thereof to the bond registrar and paying agent with a written instrument of transfer satisfactory to the bond registrar and paying agent duly executed by the registered owner or his duly authorized attorney, may be exchanged for bonds of any other authorized denominations of the same aggregate principal amount and maturity date and bearing the same rate of interest as the surrendered bond.

Each bond shall be transferable only upon the books of the Township, which shall be kept for that purpose by the bond registrar and paying agent, upon surrender of such bond together with a written instrument of transfer satisfactory to the bond registrar and paying agent duly executed by the registered owner or his duly authorized attorney.

Upon the exchange or transfer of any bond, the bond registrar and paying agent on behalf of the Township shall cancel the surrendered bond and shall authenticate and deliver to the transferee a new bond or bonds of any authorized denomination of the same aggregate principal amount and maturity date and bearing the same rate of interest as the surrendered bond. If, at the time the bond registrar and paying agent authenticates and delivers a new bond pursuant to this section, payment of interest on the bonds is in default, the bond registrar and paying agent shall endorse upon the new bond the following: "Payment of interest on this bond is in default. The last date to which interest has been paid is [insert applicable date]."

The Township and the bond registrar and paying agent may deem and treat the person in whose name any bond shall be registered upon the books of the Township as the absolute owner of such bond, whether such bond shall be overdue or not, for the purpose of receiving payment of the principal of and interest on such bond and for all other purposes, and all payments made to

any such registered owner, or upon his order, in accordance with the provisions of Section 3 of

this Bond Resolution shall be valid and effectual to satisfy and discharge the liability upon such

bond to the extent of the sum or sums so paid, and neither the Township nor the bond registrar

and paying agent shall be affected by any notice to the contrary. The Township agrees to

indemnify and save the bond registrar and paying agent harmless from and against any and all

loss, cost, charge, expense, judgment or liability incurred by it, acting in good faith and without

negligence hereunder, in so treating such registered owner.

For every exchange or transfer of bonds, the Township or the bond registrar and paying

agent may make a charge sufficient to reimburse it for any tax, fee or other governmental charge

required to be paid with respect to such exchange or transfer, which sum or sums shall be paid by

the person requesting such exchange or transfer as a condition precedent to the exercise of the

privilege of making such exchange or transfer.

10. FORM OF BONDS. The bonds shall be in substantially the following form, with such

changes as approved by the Authorized Officer and consistent with the terms of this Bond

This bond is one of a series of bonds aggregating the principal sum of

and pursuant to and in full conformity with the Constitution and Statutes of Michigan (especially

Dollars (\$______) issued by the Township under and pursuant to and in full conformity with the Constitution and Statutes of Michigan (especially Act No. 34, Public Acts of 2001, as amended) and a bond authorizing resolution adopted by the Township Board of the Township (the "Resolution") for the purpose of defraying the cost of acquiring, constructing, furnishing, and equipping a new public library facility and improving the site thereof. The issuance of the bonds of this series was approved at the general election held on November 8, 2022, by a majority of the qualified electors of the Township voting thereon.

The full faith and credit of the Township have been pledged to the prompt payment of the principal of and interest on this bond. The Township is authorized and required to levy annually ad valorem taxes, without limitation as to rate or amount, to pay such principal and interest as the same shall become due.

This bond is transferable, as provided in the Resolution, only upon the books of the Township kept for that purpose by the bond registrar and paying agent, upon the surrender of this bond together with a written instrument of transfer satisfactory to the bond registrar and paying agent duly executed by the Registered Owner or his attorney duly authorized in writing. Upon the exchange or transfer of this bond a new bond or bonds of any authorized denomination, in the same aggregate principal amount and of the same interest rate and maturity, shall be authenticated and delivered to the transferee in exchange therefor as provided in the Resolution, and upon payment of the charges, if any, therein provided. Bonds so authenticated and delivered shall be in the denomination of \$5,000 or any integral multiple thereof not exceeding the aggregate principal amount for each maturity.

The bond registrar and paying agent shall not be required to transfer or exchange bonds or portions of bonds which have been selected for redemption.

Not less than thirty nor more than sixty days' notice of redemption shall be given by firstclass mail to the registered owners of bonds called to be redeemed at their registered addresses. Failure to receive notice of redemption shall not affect the proceedings for redemption. Bonds or portions of bonds called for redemption shall not bear interest after the date fixed for redemption, provided funds are on hand with the bond registrar and paying agent to redeem the same.

It is hereby certified, recited and declared that all acts, conditions and things required to exist, happen and be performed precedent to and in the issuance of the bonds of this series, existed, have happened and have been performed in due time, form and manner as required by law, and that the total indebtedness of the Township, including the series of bonds of which this bond is one, does not exceed any constitutional, statutory or charter limitation.

11. <u>SECURITY</u>. The full faith and credit of the Township are pledged for the prompt payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds authorized by this Bond Resolution as the same shall become due. There shall be levied upon all taxable property in the Township upon the tax roll of the year 2024 and upon the tax roll of each year thereafter while any of the bonds are outstanding, an amount such that the estimated collections therefrom will be sufficient to

promptly pay at maturity the principal and interest maturing on the bonds prior to the time of the following year's tax collections. Taxes required to be levied to pay such principal and interest shall be levied without limitation as to rate or amount.

- 12. <u>ESTIMATES OF PERIOD OF USEFULNESS AND COST</u>. The estimated period of usefulness of the portion of the Project consisting of technology improvements is hereby determined to be not less than five years; the estimated period of usefulness of the portion of the Project consisting of furnishings is hereby determined to be not less than seven years; and the estimated period of usefulness of the remainder of the Project is hereby determined to be not less than thirty years. The estimated cost of the Project in the amount of not less than \$13,000,000 as submitted to the Township Board is hereby approved and adopted.
- 13. <u>USE OF BOND PROCEEDS CONSTRUCTION FUND</u>. From the proceeds of the sale of the bonds there shall be set aside in the Principal and Interest Fund any accrued interest received from the purchaser at the time of delivery of the bonds and such portion of any premium received from the purchaser at such time as determined by the Authorized Officer. The remainder of the proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be set aside in a construction fund and used to pay the costs of issuing the bonds and to acquire and construct the Project.
- 14. <u>TAX COVENANT</u>. The Township covenants to comply with all requirements of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") necessary to assure that the interest on the bonds will be and will remain excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes.
- 15. <u>DEFEASANCE</u>. In the event cash or direct obligations of the United States or obligations the principal of and interest on which are guaranteed by the United States, or a combination thereof, the principal of and interest on which, without reinvestment, come due at times and in amounts sufficient to pay, at maturity or irrevocable call for earlier optional

redemption, the principal of, redemption premium, if any, and interest on the bonds, or any portion thereof, shall have been deposited in trust, this Bond Resolution shall be defeased with respect to such bonds, and the owners of the bonds shall have no further rights under this Bond Resolution except to receive payment of the principal of, redemption premium, if any, and interest on the bonds from the cash or securities deposited in trust and the interest and gains thereon and to transfer and exchange bonds as provided herein.

- 16. REPLACEMENT OF BONDS. Upon receipt by the Treasurer of proof of ownership of an unmatured bond, of satisfactory evidence that the bond has been lost, apparently destroyed or wrongfully taken and of security or indemnity that complies with applicable law and is satisfactory to the Treasurer, the Treasurer may authorize the bond registrar and paying agent to deliver a new executed bond to replace the bond lost, apparently destroyed or wrongfully taken in compliance with applicable law. In the event an outstanding matured bond is lost, apparently destroyed or wrongfully taken, the Treasurer may authorize the bond registrar and paying agent to pay the bond without presentation upon the receipt of the same documentation required for the delivery of a replacement bond. The bond registrar and paying agent, for each new bond delivered or paid without presentation as provided above, shall require the payment of expenses, including counsel fees, which may be incurred by the bond registrar and paying agent and the Township in the premises. Any bond delivered pursuant to the provisions of this Section 17 in lieu of any bond lost, apparently destroyed or wrongfully taken shall be of the same form and tenor and be secured in the same manner as the bond in substitution for which such bond was delivered.
- 17. <u>SALE, ISSUANCE, DELIVERY, TRANSFER AND EXCHANGE OF BONDS</u>. The Bonds shall be sold at a competitive sale as hereinafter provided. The Authorized Officer is hereby authorized to approve an Official Notice of Sale for the Bonds and publish the same in accordance with law in *The Bond Buyer* at least seven days before the date set for the sale of the

Bonds. Sealed bids for the purchase of the Bonds shall be received up to such time as shall hereafter be determined by the Authorized Officer. Following the receipt of bids for the Bonds, the Bonds shall be awarded to the successful bidder therefor pursuant to an order to be executed by the Authorized Officer at the time of sale of the Bonds, which order shall set forth, with respect to the Bonds, the title or designation of the Bonds, the principal amount, principal maturities and dates, interest rates and interest payment dates, redemption provisions, if any, and purchase price to be paid by the successful bidder, as well as such other terms and provisions as the Authorized Officer determines to be necessary or appropriate in connection with the sale of the Bonds. Alternatively, if determined to be in the best interest of the Township, the Authorized Officer is authorized to reject all bids and negotiate the terms of sale with a purchaser as determined by the Authorized Officer. In making determinations in the order awarding the Bonds to the low bidder with respect to principal maturities and dates, interest rates and purchase price of the Bonds, the Authorized Officer shall be limited as follows:

- (a) The interest rate on any Bond shall not exceed 6% per annum.
- (b) The final maturity date of the Bonds shall not be later than May 1, 2054.
- (c) The purchase price of the Bonds shall not be less than 99.0% of the principal amount thereof.

The Authorized Officer is hereby authorized for and on behalf of the Township, without further Township Board approval, to: (a) approve the circulation of a preliminary and a final Official Statement describing the Bonds; (b) to award the bid for the sale of the Bonds; (c) purchase municipal bond insurance, if considered necessary, as additional security for the bondholders; (d) apply to rating agencies for a rating on the Bonds; (e) make any designations or elections pursuant to the Code; and (f) do all other acts and take all other necessary procedures required to effectuate the sale, issuance and delivery of the Bonds.

Approval by the Township of the matters delegated in this section or any other sections may be evidenced by execution or approval of such documents by the Authorized Officer. The Authorized Officer, together with the Clerk, and all other officials of the Township, or any one or more of them, are authorized to execute any documents or certificates necessary to complete the transaction, including, but not limited to, any applications, an Application for State Treasurer's Approval to Issue Long-Term Securities or any other applications or supporting documents to the Michigan Department of Treasury, applications for waivers and the submission of any supporting or related documents, any certificates, receipts, orders, agreements, instruments, security reports, a blanket letter of representations, and any certificates relating to federal or state securities laws, rules or regulations.

18. OFFICIAL STATEMENT; CONTINUING DISCLOSURE: The Authorized Officer is authorized to cause the preparation of an official statement for the Bonds for purposes of compliance with Rule 15c2-12 issued under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended (the "Rule") and to do all other things necessary to comply with the Rule. After the award of the Bonds, the Township will provide copies of a "final official statement" (as defined in paragraph (f)(3) of the Rule) on a timely basis and in reasonable quantity as requested by the purchasers to enable the purchasers to comply with paragraph (b)(4) of the Rule and the rules of the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board. The Authorized Officer is authorized to enter into such agreements as may be required to enable the purchasers to comply with the Rule.

The Authorized Officer is hereby authorized to execute and deliver in the name of and on behalf of the Township (i) a certificate of the Township to comply with the requirement for a continuing disclosure undertaking of the Township pursuant to subsection (b)(5) of the Rule, as applicable, and (ii) amendments to such certificate from time to time in accordance with the terms of such certificate (the certificate and any amendments thereto are collectively referred to herein as the "Continuing Disclosure Certificate"). The Township hereby covenants and agrees

that it will comply with and carry out all of the provisions of the Continuing Disclosure Certificate. The remedies for any failure of the Township to comply with or carry out the provisions of the Continuing Disclosure Certificate shall be as set forth therein.

- 19. <u>BOND INSURANCE</u>. The Authorized Officer is authorized and directed to take any actions that may be necessary or appropriate to purchase a policy or policies of municipal bond insurance with respect to the bonds to the extent that such officer determines that the purchase of such municipal bond insurance is in the best interests of the Township. If the Authorized Officer makes such a determination, the purchase of a policy or policies and the payment of premiums therefor and the execution by such officer of any necessary commitments with respect thereto are hereby authorized.
- 20. <u>APPOINTMENTS</u>. The firm of Dickinson Wright PLLC is hereby approved as bond counsel to the Township for the issuance of the Bonds, with such fee as is provided in the financial report of the municipal advisor. The Township acknowledges that Dickinson Wright PLLC represents a number of financial institutions in unrelated public finance matters, including financial institutions that may potentially purchase the Bonds, and consents to Dickinson Wright PLLC's representation of the Township as bond counsel and, and waives any conflict of interest arising from such representation of a financial institution or underwriter that may purchase the Bonds in other matters not involving the Township.
